Review Q2: What else did God make? – *God made all things.*

Read: Ps 19: 1-6

Questions:

1. It means that He did these things so that you and everyone else could see what He is like (to reveal Himself), and honor Him for these things. *Glory is worthiness, honor, deserving of praise. “This denotes the revelation of God’s being, nature, and presence to mankind, sometimes with physical phenomena.”*

2. Looking at it carefully, it shows us that He must be powerful – to have made all that He has out of nothing; wise – in that it all works together so well; and good – in that it is exactly what we need to live.

3. God has given to us everything we have, even the ability to do the things we do. We must not take the credit for these things, but give the credit to God.
1 Cor. 10:31; Rev.4:11

Gospel: Since the Fall, we no longer want to glorify God, but ourselves (give ourselves the credit for what we do and hope others will see it and honor us). Jesus came to turn us away from our sins and to show us that we must again live to glorify/bring recognition/give credit to God. To do this, you must turn from your sins and trust in Jesus. If you do, He will forgive you and give you the ability to glorify God.
